#### Introduction

- Reduced challenging/disruptive behaviors by over 50% since implementing CPI de-escalation techniques.
- Decreased the use of physical restraint and seclusion by 75-99% since implementing CPI training.
- Agrees that the enhanced content has helped them, their staff, and their organization.
- Achieved return on investment with CPI by:
  - Reducing injuries
  - Reducing worker compensation claims
  - Reducing liability
  - Improving staff skills and confidence
  - Creating better communication between staff and students
