# Metro Public Library

## Introduction

This case study of a cultural institution is based on a January 2019 survey of Polaris customers by TechValidate, a 3rd-party research service. The profiled organization asked to have their name blinded to protect their confidentiality.

# Challenges

After comparing with other solutions (including Horizon and Symphony), the library team decided to go with Polaris.

The key challenges they chose Polaris to help address included:

- Reducing time spent supporting discovery and circulation
- Improving the patron experience
- Reducing time spent on reporting and analysis

#### Use Case

The organization purchased Polaris specifically because of the following features:

- Breadth and depth of ILS functionality
- Streamlined workflow and overall system efficiency
- Simplified reporting and analytics

Other factors in their decision to purchase the Polaris Web Application (LEAP) product included responsive design and web-based mobility for public services and reference staff. They use nearly all of the client modules, in addition to LEAP.

# Results

Overall, the team would rate Polaris as better than the competition for overall functionality. They rated Polaris at 4/5 stars and would recommend it to others, especially those working at public libraries.
